- ...

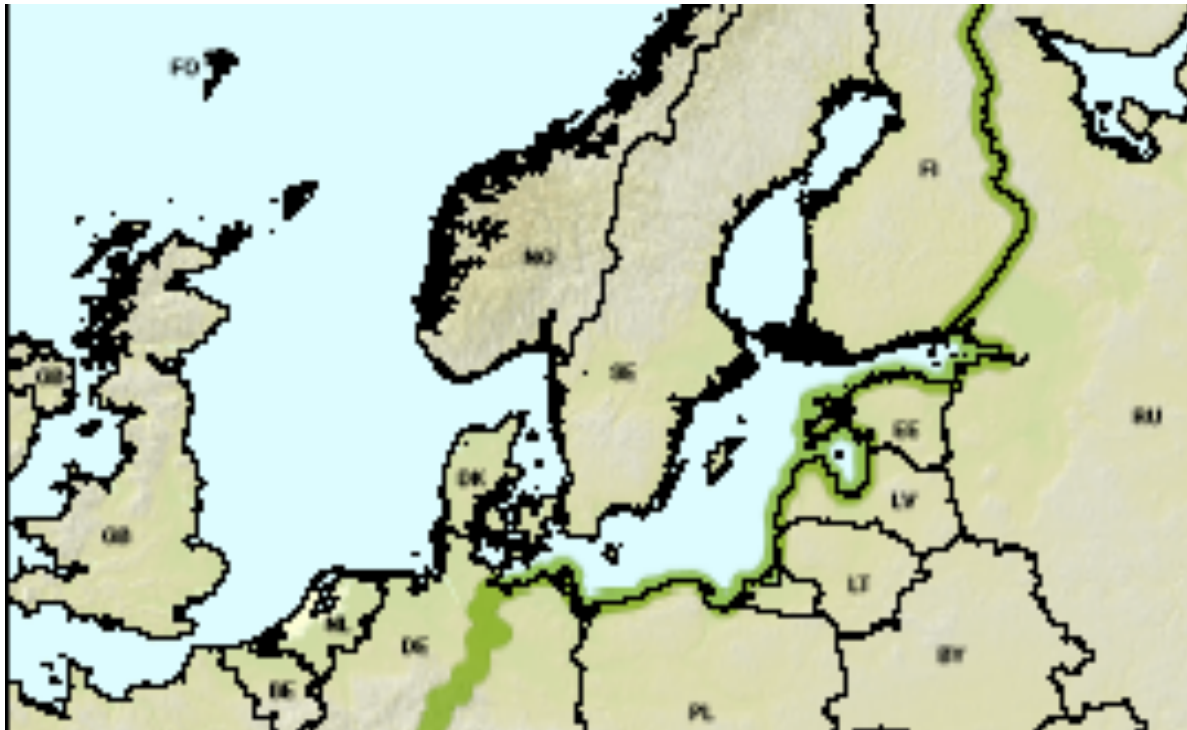
Financing
