Warsaw, Poland, 03-04 November 2010

It's high time to combat the main source of eutrophication of our inland waters and Baltic Sea at the end. Over-fertilization and nutrients' run-off from agriculture production are the key problems in Baltic Sea catchment!

CCB in cooperation with **Global Water Partnership PL** are organizing a two-days' seminar to share experiences and empower for actions and lobbying on national levels.

We would welcome to hear your voice in discussion about the situation in your countries. This seminar is the opportunity to meet representatives of science and administration, farmers and NGOs to exchange the opinions and lobby for the best policies, practices and barriers for nutrient's disposal into Baltic Sea.

We would like to invite at least one representative of each member organization, who works on sustainable agriculture development, especially from Baltic EU countries (with special focus on Latvia, Lithuania, Estonia, Poland). Non-EU member states' organizations (Ukraine, Belarus, Russia) are welcome too, to get prepared for accomplishing the EU standards for sustainable agriculture.
